MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER - The Genesee City Council met in regular session on May 6, 2014. Mayor Steve Odenborg called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL – Present at the meeting were council members Ryan Banks, Edie McLachlan, Art Lindquist, Cathleen Blevins, and City Clerk Debi Zenner.

VISITORS: Brigham and Tonya Hubbard asked for an amendment to their encroachment agreement to allow them to put up a moveable/temporary structure to allow them to have chickens. Ryan made a motion to include the addition of the moveable chicken coop and Cathleen 2nd; Ayes; motion carried.

Tom Lamar, who is running for Latah County Commissioner also stopped by to sit in on the meeting.

CONSENT AGENDA Edie McLachlan made a motion, seconded by Ryan Banks to approve the consent agenda, with the additional of "Latah Sheriff" before Sergeant Greg Pannell on April 15 minutes. **ROLL CALL VOTE; Banks, McLachlan, Lindquist, Blevins, Ayes; motion carried.**

CITY OFFICIAL, COUNCIL AND STAFF REPORTS-

Cathleen Blevins- Plans to buy and plant flowers this weekend. Steve mentioned the portable toilet, located in the park, will be paid out of Administration instead of Parks. There was also discussion regarding re-opening the restrooms, by the playground, putting trail cameras in birdhouses, to monitor, in case there are problems. We could also have the city workers keep an eye on them when they drive by during the day. Art mentioned putting in a few more around town as well.

Art Lindquist- Fire and Police- No law enforcement issues. Working out ways to better keep informed with city updates. Next week the union buildings will be torn down. Discussion regarding bringing the water/sewer lines to the RV restroom facility, but holding off on putting a meter in until there is a building. The alley behind Mary's Nursery was discussed. Jay Roach has volunteered to handle all of the construction, as well as donating the rock. (Ryan said he has been talking to Jay about this) Art also handed out Wetland information. Discussion about animal traps.

Ryan Banks- Streets- Ryan discussed the Idaho bicycle and Pedestrian Alliance (IBPA) Meeting, ADA compliance plan, safe route to school, new sidewalks for the sports complex and different funding opportunities. Discussed having a map in the city booth, on Community Day, and ask people to draw where they mainly walk in town to get a better idea of what sidewalks need to be replaced and how the city feels about it. He also would like to inform the community that we received the LHTAC Grant. Jacob Wells requested the streets be swept in Valleyview. Ryan will call and arrange for this to be done. Next year they will clean them in April or May instead of just before Community Day.

Edie McLachlan- Water and Sewer- Since the water adjudication meeting, Edie has been researching ways to make our priority date from 1981 back to 1901. This change will cost \$25. Edie will also research farms in the area and talk to them, as well as Earl Bennett to see if they have documentation when they first obtained water.
